Black people dehumanised in modernity (Mushonga et al., 2022)

Pernicious and targeted (Gordon, 2018; Grimes, 2020)

Social Death (Patterson, 2018)

Has a non-anachronistic afterlife (Hartman, 2007)

Linked inextricably with Racial Capitalism see Cedric Robinson, 2000; Bledsoe and Wright, 2018; Ruth Wilson Gilmore, 2021




Figure 1. burning embers figure for selected key risks from climate change in Africa
